Heap Participates in "Take A Player To School"



As the guest of fifth grader Travis Justice, Ravens TE Todd Heap visited Elkridge Elementary School (Elkridge, MD) on Tuesday (11/10). Justice was the Baltimore-area winner for the NFL's annual "Take a Player to School" contest.

Heap picked up Justice from his house in a limo. Upon their arrival at school, the pair was greeted by a purple-clad throng of students and staff. Todd and Travis made a brief stop in the principal's office and then made their way to the assembly of more than 800 students chanting "Travis."



Justice quickly introduced Heap on stage, and the Pro Bowl TE spoke to the crowd about the NFL Play 60 campaign that encourages youth to be physically active for at least 60 minutes a day.



After a brief Q&A, Heap led Justice and his classmates through an "ultimate gym class" that included footwork and passing drills and a pick-up game of flag football.

He explained his expectations to the participants and outlined the program. The group will meet weekly and focus on topics such as current events, nutrition and culture.
